Rabbi's Corner - WHO IS WISE?

grew up in a wonderful Temple in Norfolk, VA called Ohef Sholom. My rabbi was Larry Forman, and he is still connected there after forty-some years. I always looked up to my rabbi and saw him as an innovator and a teacher. I was excited when I entered my Confirmation year, because Rabbi Forman taught that class. As an active par-

ticipant in the temple and in the regional youth groups, I was ready to learn about Judaism, Torah, and To my sur-Israel. prise, one of our first weeks at Sunday School was a field trip - not to the Jewish Center. community not to the mikveh at

the Orthodox shul, not even to the bagel store. No, our trip was to the Baptist church a few blocks away. I did not even know there was a Baptist church there. We sat through a Sunday morning service and then reconvened back at the temple. There, we discussed the structure of the church service, what we felt about the sermon, and talked about the symbols on their stained glass

windows. I honestly have no recollection about any of those particulars. But I remember asking myself why a trip to a church was part of my Jewish education.

But the seed was planted. As I grew more and more committed to Judaism, I began to feel more comfortable exploring other religious communities. And I recognized that my

> faith was strengthened when I engaged with other communities. Because, as an ambassador of Judaism, I always must be readv to explain various customs, rituals, or theological questions about Judaism. And that

requires me - us - to become better informed Jews. Interfaith dialogue prompts us to strengthen our Jewish identity.

In addition to strengthening our identities, interfaith dialogue also gives us another opportunity for social action. By ourselves, the Jewish community can make a positive difference by social action programs

and by giving tzedakah. But if we work together with other faith communities we can make an enormous impact. Ultimately, we must all do our part to bring relief to the suffering, and aid to those in pain. Here in Tyler, we are blessed to have many non-profits that address social justice concerns. And we must appreciate that that call to righteous service comes from a universal religious sensitivity. We recognize that working together with other faith communities - we can make an impact in the lives of our neighbors in need.

Over the years, I have been asked to offer prayers at various non-profit events around town. And I try to address the universal call to social action using a Jewish voice. I share with you one of my prayers by way of example:

Hiney mah tov u'mah na'im, shevet achim gam yachad. The psalmist cried out: "Behold how good and pleasant it is for brothers [and sisters] to dwell together in unity." (Psalms 133:1)

Lord our God, you know that there are many paths to You. Christians, Muslims, Jews, and other Godfearing people are all in the same forest, yet on different paths, all striving to do Your will.

And whatever our faith may be, each of us is drawn to righteous action because deep down in the marrow of our existence, we have the belief that we are all divine servants. And when your children of different faiths come togther to serve those in our community who need relief, who need an ear to listen, who need hope, and who need to retain their dignity, when we come together to provide these services, we are doing holy work.

The variety of faiths is like a mosaic, each stone with a well-defined boundary and purpose, with its own unique size, color and characteristics, but ultimately it is part of a larger work of art. May we appreciate our boundaries, and yet always support one another in our work for the greater welfare of our community. God, we pray that our different faiths will not prevent us from embracing one another - we pray instead for moments of holy collaboration.

The ancient rabbis ask the question "Eizeh Hu Chacham?" - Who is wise?

To which they answer "Shelomed mi kol adam" - One who learns from all people.

We all have something to teach and to offer - and may we be guided in wisdom to learn from one another.

Lord our God, we bless you and thank you for allowing us to reach this moment in unity with our brother and sisters. Amen.

I pray that we open up our minds and hearts to learning about other religious cultures, and in that learning process, we grow intellectually and spiritually as Jews. As we learn about other theologies and rituals, may we come to feel more comfortable in our own theology and observances. May we continue to join hands with our neighbors in learning and celebration, in service and collaboration. In this way, we may continue doing God's work together.
